# Picnic area hazardous

The bridle path was flooded with one foot of water with the rest of the area totally underwater by at least four feet by the Bug Hotel and new bench under the willow tree. BRAG volunteers were able to notify the relevant authorities that the cause was the culvert that goes under the canal which was completely blocked, making the flood water back up in the field ditches towards this area. A warning has been placed on the BRAG Facebook page that this area is now hazardous, especially for small children, as the risk of drowning is high, especially where the land dips towards the ditch. Also, the area (especially the path) will be covered in muddy silt, so slippage is very likely. BRAG would like to extend this warning to all readers of the Villager. Work to clear the blockage will take place when the flood water recedes so hopefully the weather will be on our side and remain drier.

During the last 18 months as your Good Neighbour Co-ordinator I have been providing information and signposting for older people in the Melksham villages who need help to connect with local services and sources of support. Wiltshire Council has taken the decision that this provision will be delivered differently in the future, and the statement below explains this. Wiltshire Council entered into a partnership with Community First in 2010, this partnership comes to an end in April 2016. The decision has been made not to renew this partnership but to work differently and facilitate local wellbeing through the county's area boards.

A Wiltshire Council spokesperson said: "Protecting those who feel isolated and lonely is a key priority for us. We asked older people what kind of services they felt should be available within their community and, based on this feedback, we have decided to provide this service in a different way.

"Our local area boards sit right at the heart of our communities and are ideally placed to provide and coordinate this new way of working. The new approach will build on the success of existing networks and links the area boards have. This will ensure local people connect with the resources and services they need to improve their wellbeing and help them remain independent within their community."

"We would also like to acknowledge the work that the Good Neighbour Coordinators and Community First have delivered over the last five years. This work has contributed significantly to our understanding of the support that vulnerable and older people across Wiltshire need."

### **Bowerhill Beat**

It is time for the first Bowerhill Beat report of the year and this month's edition includes reports going back before the Christmas break.

Our first report comes from the 17th November last year when two cars were stolen from Tangmere Close. Two adult males were stopped and located near Bristol with the vehicles; they were arrested and later charged in relation to the theft.

We took a report of graffiti that took place in Kingfisher Drive on 2nd December where someone wrote 'Hello' on someone's fence panel. This thoughtless act is not exactly the abusive or offensive graffiti which can upset the general public, but you have to consider the time and effort it takes for someone to have to clean this up.

We have taken a few reports of criminal damage and anti-social activities within Catalina Court. Between the 23rd and 28th December, a Ford Mondeo was deliberately scratched along the side of the car. Then again between the 6th and 8th January, a Mercedes Benz was damaged by the same method whilst one address had its door, fence and gate spray painted. Then between the 15th and 16th January, a Nissan Micra

Offices - Unit 4C Broad Lane Farm Ind. Estate, Broad Lane, Seend, Wiltshire, SN12 6RJ had its car doors deliberately scratched and tyres slashed. These criminal acts of damage have caused a degree of concern and uncertainty within the residents around this area. There does not appear to be any explanation that can be given as to why the vehicles in this location have been targeted so frequently, and Melksham Neighbourhood Policing Team are keen to hear from anyone who may have any information about these offences.

On the 4th January, Police took a report of milk cartons which had been delivered to Bowerhill Primary School being thrown across the road causing a mess. The school itself did not actually start back until the following day and therefore the milk that had been delivered was not collected as per the norm by the school staff.

Sometime between the 5th and 10th January we had a report of an attempted break in to a caravan parked up in Barnes Wallis Close. A window was forced open by the offenders who did not appear to gain full entry to the caravan itself, and nothing appears to have been stolen. Around the same time and area of Bowerhill, we have taken a report of a garage belonging to a property on Mitchell Drive being broken into on two separate occasions. The first happening between the 8th and 9th January overnight when a fleece blanket was removed, and the second occurred a few days later, again overnight between the 11th and 12th January when some music albums were stolen.

Police are also investigating a series of events that took place across Bowerhill

overnight between the 15th and 16th January. We took reports of Melksham Oak School being bro-



ken into, cars being damaged in Belvedere Road, and vehicles being interfered with at Turnpike Garage and around that location. Police later arrested an adult male who has been released pending further enquiries.

Our last report is of further damage caused to a Vauxhall Astra that was parked up on Halifax Road which had its bonnet and wing mirrors damaged sometime overnight between the 15th and 16th January. At present it is not known if this report is linked to those above, in which the male has been arrested, so we ask anyone who may have information about any of these offences to call the Police.

#### Air Ambulance Visits Bowerhill

On Sunday January 10th not one, but two Air Ambulances attended an emergency in Bowerhill. One landed in Barnes Wallis Close and the second in a field off Brabazon Way. We understand the first was carrying paramedics and the second, a doctor to attend a lady who had collapsed at home.

Wiltshire Air Ambulance was established in March 1990 as a joint venture between the Wiltshire Ambulance Service NHS Trust and the Wiltshire Constabulary. They are a registered charity and rely almost entirely on public donations.

## Update on proposed new home

held during August for Wiltshire Air Ambulance's proposed new home, the charity's Board of Trustees agreed to purchase its preferred site. The 12.6 acre site is on land at Outmarsh Farm, Semington (immediately south of Hampton Park West Industrial Estate).

The purchase of the land is subject to planning permission being granted and they submitted an Outline Planning Application to Wiltshire Council, which was registered at the end of November. The planning application – reference number 15/10766/OUT - can be viewed online at www.wiltshire.gov.uk.

The target date for a decision on the planning application is the middle of February 2016. If planning permission is granted, they plan to hold a public consultation event before submitting a Reserved Matters Planning Application to Wiltshire Council detailing the proposed layout and design of the site. They anticipate this public consultation event to be in the Spring (2016).

Mandy Clarke, chairman of Wiltshire Air Ambulance, said: "Our proposed new home would be a purpose-built, futureproof facility for our helicopter, aircrew and charity staff.

"The feedback we received during our public consultation was overwhelmingly positive and re-affirmed our view that the Outmarsh Farm site was our preferred lo-

## Option 24/7

Wiltshire Council are consulting on how the residents of Wiltshire want them to save money on bus subsidies by offering six different options for removing funds by cutting Saturdays and/or Sundays and evenings, cutting most town buses and most rural services, or reducing daytime buses to every two hours.

For Bowerhill residents, this could mean that the first bus would arrive from Bath at around 9:30 am, with the last one coming back at around 16:30, Monday to Friday only. (Melksham to Bath counts as 271 and 272, x72, Hopper, and x76!)

Contrary to what Wiltshire Council is proposing, rather than looking at individual routes in isolation, the new Buses Bill heralds a system which looks at the network as a whole. You might have two buses an hour - every 30 minutes - from Bowerhill to Bath, with alternate services running via Atworth and via Corsham, extended to the Royal United Hospital in Bath. This includes buses in the early morning and evening too, and with weekend services continuing to run.
